**THE BEST WAY**  
To Overcome Difficulties Encountered by All Housekeepers.

Stored potatoes may be prevented from sprouting and will keep much better if the earth or cellar floor on which they rest. Another layer of lime should be added on the pile, at the height of five feet, should they be placed in a bin that high. This treatment not only keeps the potatoes from rotting, but conserves their meanness.

To remove a rusty screw, apply a hot iron to it for a few minutes and then remove it in the usual way with a screw-driver. The screw will then come out easily.

To clean stains from bone or ivory handles on knives, rub them with a soft paste made by mixing whiting with lemon juice. This should be well rubbed in and then the handles should be rinsed in warm water and dried carefully.

To clean white ostrich feathers, make a solution of four ounces of white soap cut small and four quarts of rather hot water. Beat this into a lather with a paddle or clean large spoon. Dip the feathers in this, gently wring out, and well for five or six minutes. Then wash in clear water as hot as the hands can bear, and shake until dry.

**GASOLINE.**  
Will not remove spots made by mud, flour or paste. It is very efficient where grease is concerned, and this is why stains made by meat or salad dressing or gravy do not entirely disappear when treated with gasoline. This grease has been attacked but the fat or oil substance used in the gravy still remains in the form of a solid. Sometimes merely rubbing between the hands will remove this; if not, try brushing with a clean brush.

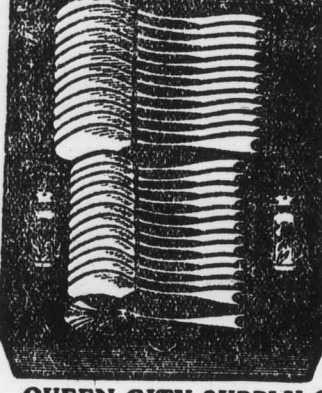

**UNIFORMITY IN CANADIAN DAIRY PRODUCTS.**

A few months ago there was held at Ottawa a conference of dairy exporters and officials from all parts of the Dominion. The meeting was called by the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture for the purpose of endeavoring to perpetuate the uniformity in quality and character of Canadian cheese and butter that has been responsible for the success of Canadian dairying. As pointed out by the dairy and cold storage commissioner, who presided over the conference, many things come up in the practice of dairying over which slight difference of opinion may arise, so that it seems desirable to bring together from time to time those in charge of dairy schools, and the chief instructors in the various provinces, to discuss methods and practices, in order to arrive at some agreement as a body of dairy advisors. The conference lasted two days, during which time many matters of importance were taken up and freely discussed. Some of these were the pasteurization of whey, factory refuse in relation to tuberculosis in hogs, feeding and grading cream at cream gathering creameries, whey butter, methods of paying patrons of cheese factories, and other subjects relating to the production of butter and cheese. For the information of buttermakers and cheesemakers, and others interested in dairying, there has been printed a verbatim report of the proceedings of this conference. Copies may be procured by applying to the Publications Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa.

**THE CHINESE HOME.**

Some of the Curious Details of Oriental Life.  
It is difficult for the Occidental mind to picture the wall-within-wall life of a Chinese home. Down a narrow lane one passes between two walls behind which may be hovels or palaces, there is no telling which since the one-story roofs beyond are invisible.

One pulls a string at a gateway, the address of some family of high degree. A servant appears, leads courtyard, a passageway, perhaps another courtyard, a little room or two, and finally into a reception room, with its carved wood wainscoting and furniture, its porcelains and jades and bronzes, its blue-and-green-and-gold ceiling, and its window pattern of paper panes.

Here the hostess appears, offers her Occidental guest tea or champagne, or both, with cakes and candied fruit or lotus-loaves. In one may lead one through other courtyards, all with the usual one-story rooms around them, and into her secluded garden of rocks and ponds, of pretty paths and bridges, of clustering trees and flowers.

In such a palace as this, each courtyard with its surrounding rooms, may be the special home of one of the sons and his wife and children, but somewhere in the maze of walls, under one of the low, tiled roofs, is the common dining-room, with the kitchen beyond. Here the men of the family eat together twice a day, and afterward the women and children. And somewhere also there is a central family hall, with the ancestral tablets, which must have their tribute of incense at proper seasons. These are held in such reverence that no foot may pass above them, and therefore two-story dwellings are unknown in regions uncolonized by foreign influence. One tablecloth, three and a half yards long, for every-day use, or, if it is thought best, two of these may be two yards long for the small table.

Half a dozen lunch cloths that may, if desired, be used for her own solitary luncheons.

One dozen napkins to match the best everyday use, two dozen of a smaller size for every-day use and a dozen doilies for evening use.

One dozen each plate and tumbler for breakfast or luncheon.

One silver cloth, three yards long and one yard and three quarters long.

Five covers, doilies for breakfast and serving table.

Confessionaries of every-day use and for best.

One laundry bag in which soiled table linen may be kept.

One dozen dish towels, one dozen dish cloths, one dozen dust cloths, keeping half a dozen of each of these in reserve.

Two covers for the furniture, and keeping one of them in reserve.

Half a dozen ironing boards made at home from clean pieces of soft cloth and covered with fresh tissues.

Two small tablecloths for kitchen use if a maid is to be kept.

Phonograph, gramophone, wicker chairs, chairs, and a plentiful supply of clean old sheets and pillowcases for use before her own supply begins to grow old.
