Ottawa, April 18.—(Toronto Star Special)—The Canadian Ministers have made no secret of their desire that the scenic grandeur of Niagara Falls should not be destroyed by the power interests, and the speech from the throne at the opening of the present session of Parliament contained an expression to that effect. But they are also determined that if we meet the wishes of the United States for a treaty between the two countries to preserve the Falls, Uncle Sam must at the same time consent to a permanent understanding upon other water-power questions of importance to Canadian interests that have arisen along the international boundary.

This is the view that the Canadian representatives on the International Waterways Commission will present to their American brethren when the commission meets on the 26th inst. either in Buffalo or Washington, to resume consideration of the Niagara Falls problem.
