

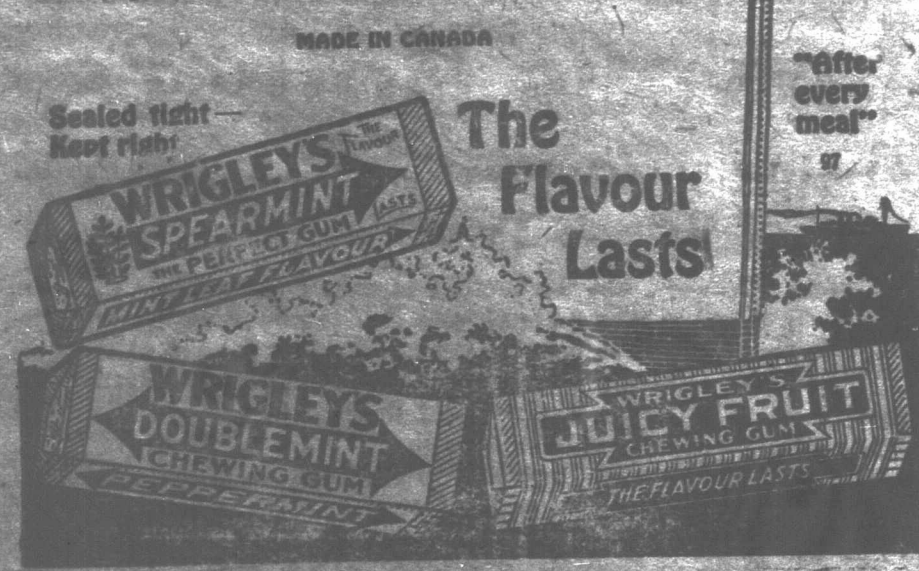

Allen W. Shaw

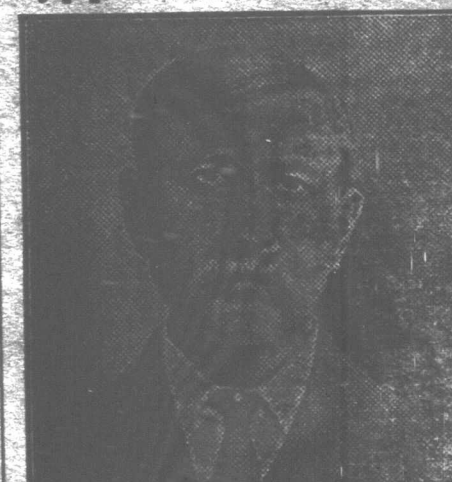
