



"The worst of it is that protty soon these children come to age. They feel that they have been rob-bed in some way-not robbed in money or property, but robbed of of health, robbed of intellect, robbed of spirit. And in their undeveloped brains, in their cramped and deformed souls the fires of an unextinguishable wrath begin to burn. They know that a system of industry and a state of society has worse than murdered them. There s your material for anarchy. We hear a good many speeches about the danger of anarchists coming to this country from Europe. The truth is that child labor is creating some two hundred thousand grown-up anarchists of native American blood in this country every year."




