
Washington, May 28 .- A sharp cut the consumer is the aim of the "pepper and salt company" in which many prominent people are said to be interested, among them Gifford Pinchot former Chief Forester, and P. V. De Graw, former assistant Postmaster-General. The "company" to-day applied to the commissioners of the district for space in the municipal markets in which to receive and disburse wares to its stockholders. The plan as announced is to cater to 10.000 families in the beginning, who will be sold vegetables and other farm products at a price slightly above cost The customers will be supplied through three hundred of the bes housekeepers in selected localities, who, in return for their services in a nominal salary each week.
