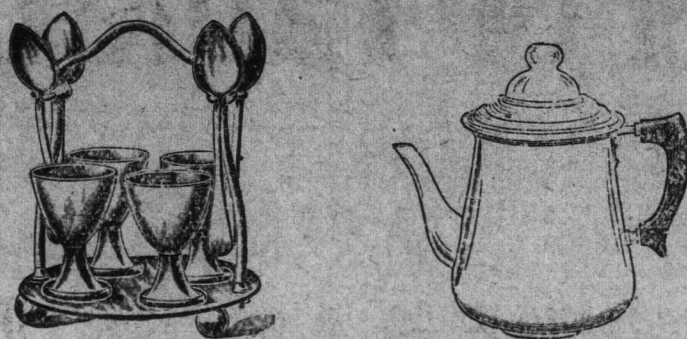

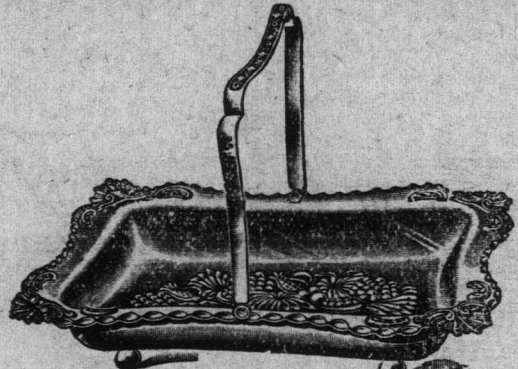

The annual meeting of the shareholders of the steamers Bellaventure and Bonaventure was held last evening at the office of Messrs. A. J. Harvey & Co., managing owners. Hon. M. G. Winter presided and others present were Sir Joseph Outerbridge, Hon. James Angel, Geo. Knowling, J. D. Ryan, John Harvey, R. K. Bishop, James Ryan and Messrs. K. R. Prowse, G. W. B. Ayre, Wm. Cook, Tasker Cook, Gordon Winter, David Baird, P. McNamara, Thos. Harris, D. Galway, J. Hancock and A. D. Brown. All last year's Directors were again appointed with the addition of Hon. John Harvey, as President of the Bellaventure s.s. Co., and Hon. Jas. Ryan, President of the Bonaventure s.s. Co., both succeeding the late Hon. J. S. Pitts. The reports presented showed that both ships had a successful year and that despite the bad seal-fishery a substantial amount was placed to the credit of the shareholders. A dividend of 15 p.c. was declared. It was decided that out of the reserve fund both ships will be sent to England next year to be lengthened.
