Propagation of Salmon.—The Whitby Gazette says Mr. W. R. Wilmot, of Newcastle, shipped last week some 10,000 young salmon to Duffin's Creek to be planted there. It adds:—This establishment—situated in Newcastle—has been very successful in its operations. During the past season almost half a million of fish, consisting mostly of salico trout, have been safely hatched out, and are now being sent broadcast throughout the country—gratis. Mr. Wilmot deserves great credit for the enterprise thus displayed in inaugurating and fostering this new industry in this country.
