SPONER BREAKS THE RECORD.
CHICAGO, July 10.—Spooner finished his 24 hour bicycle ride at Parkside last evening, breaking the world's best previous record of 363 and a fraction miles. He accomplished 375 miles less 155 yards. After the last lap the exhausted rider was assisted from his wheel and taken to a cot in the club house by Stackpole. He was unable to walk alone, and staggered as he was assisted into the house. After resting on the cot for half an hour he was brought out on the porch and seated in a chair, where many eager friends pressed forward to shake the hand of the world's champion. Over 1,000 people were present to see him make the final laps.



DOMINION PARLIAMENT

Proregation-Closing Scenes-The Governor-General's Speech.

OTTAWA, July 10. - The House sat for one hour Saturday morning, rising at 12:30 to meet at 2:30 for prorogation. Only 25 mem

ors were present.
