LIVERPOOL DAIRY REPORT, WEEK ENDING JUNE 16.

[Hodgson Bros' Letter.]

Cheese.—This has been a lively week, but there has been a steady retail consumption demand for both old and new cheese. Old are now almost exhausted, and the bulk of the arrivals of new are too green to please buyers, and the cool chambers on the Canadian steamers have hindered the development of the early made cheese this year, so that some of them have reached here practically as green as when they were shipped two or three weeks ago. The decline in the market appears to have been checked this week, owing to good buying in Canada of the early made cheese, which has caused a slight advance, and today's c.l.f. quotations are a loss to importers on present values here, and yet, if an advance is attempted, buyers will resist it very much, as they say the early market of English cheese is coming in freely, much better value. We quote today: Finest old Canadian, white, 48c per cwt. do, colored, 50c to 51c; finest new Canadian, colored, 48c to 49c; do, do, 46c to 47c; do, do, 44c to 45c.

"TEXAS" FULLY IDENTIFIED;

WILL FIGHT EXTRADITION

London Detectives See the Notorious Burglar and Jail-Breaker at Port Huron.

"Texas" Burdell and no other is the man who was locked up in Port Huron on Friday last and held on suspicion.

The Port Huron police were morally positive of his identity from his resemblance to photographs of "Texas," which they saw in one of the circulars sent out after the desperado's escape from this city.

The London police were satisfied when they saw a photo of the captured man on Saturday, and the matter was made certain yesterday by a trip to Port Huron on the part of Detectives Nickle and Egerton.

"Texas" refused to come to London without extradition, but this will, of course, be only a question of time, for Crown Attorney McKillop has already begun proceedings.

Sheriff Thomas Moore, of Port Huron, brought a photo of "Texas" to this city on Saturday evening, and the London detectives recognized the prisoner as it was shown to them.

Photos taken of "Texas" when he was in the toils here were produced and compared with the one brought by Moore. It could be seen that "Texas" had not changed much during the past two years, his face still bearing the same wide-braked expression, his mouth retaining the old peculiar droop and the forehead the same lines.

The only difference was that in the earlier photos the hair was dark, and underneath stood the number "17528." In the later photo the hair was neatly parted and the prison mark absent.

"What made you suspect first of all that the man was 'Texas'?" Moore was asked.

"One of the men was turning over the leaves of an old copy of The Detective (a police journal edited in Chicago) and he came across the picture of 'Texas,' and thought it looked very much like the man we had."

Mr. Moore explained more clearly the reason why the man had been arrested by the Port Huron police. Several barroom tills and gum-slot machines had been robbed during the past week, and the police suspected that "Texas" was carrying a superabundance of small change. "Texas" went to a bank on Friday and said that he had been robbed of \$200, and thus had come into the possession of a great deal of small change which he desired to turn into money.

Moore said that "Texas" had, however, refused to change the money. "Texas" then went to another bank, immediately across the road, and succeeded in getting the teller to change \$2 for him, was at the third bank that the police were notified and the desperado captured.

It is true that "Texas" pulled his gun on his captors. Mr. Moore was asked.

"Not exactly. You see, Deputy Sheriff Radick and Police Captain Collins came up from behind. They were just about to grab him when 'Texas' turned and saw them, and he quickly moved his left hand towards his inside coat pocket. But Collins and Radick grabbed him like this," and Mr. Moore placed a professional grip on the reporter's wrist to illustrate the point.

"When they searched him afterwards they found the gun."

There was no proof that "Texas" was the man who had robbed the tills, so a charge was registered against him of carrying concealed arms. His sentence on this charge is 45 days. "Texas" had about \$17 in small change on him when searched.

Chief of Police Williams has expressed his surprise that a clever crook as Burdell would so expose himself as to go into a bank and try to exchange a large lot of small change for two cents.

An interesting circumstance is that when "Texas" reached for his gun in the bank in Port Huron, he made the motion with his left hand. The observant police noticed this, and later on remembered that "Texas" had been described as being right-handed.

The trial of "Texas" Burdell will be watched with the greatest interest in this city, the story of his capture at Port Huron, his escape from this street and of his sensational escape from the jail being fresh in the memory of all.

The steel cell which successive grand juries and committees of the county council have been from time to time recommending for the county jail has yet to be built. What means will be taken to make the desperado secure in the old structure remains to be seen. His trial will doubtless come off at the fall assizes.
