MANCHU SOLDIERS ASSASSINATE GOVERNOR

General Wu Put to Death While Asleep in Tent. Peking. China, Nov. 7.—Gen. Wu, & brilliant young military officer, who was recently appointed governor of Shanghai Province, was assassinated at 1 o'clock this morning. He was asleep in his tent at the military encampment at Shikia Chuang, when 30 Manchu soldiers rushed in past the guard and murdered him. When officers of the general staff interrogated the Manchus they stated that Wu had gone over the revolutionaries, and was secretly betraying the Manchus. Gen. Wu was educated in Jpsan, and had risen rapidly since his session to China. He was liberal in his views, and was always credited with sympathy with reform movements, although he was not an extremist.
