Getting Labor When Labor Is Scarce

Common labor is scarce. Farmers are pinched, in a great many places, to get the help they need. General contractors, if they are not energetic, are hard put to it to properly man jobs. The shortage is extending, to, beyond any doubt, to many factory

Employers remember well all the difficulties a labor shortage can bring on, from experience during the war boom. It is time to prepare for any shortage stress which may come in the next few months.

Happily, we can draw on the same experience to which we made reference above-the war boom. Valiantly in those days Want Ads saved the day innumerable times for employers. Here are lessons learned:

Use plenty of words, and tell in your Want Ad how good a job you offer. The old theory, that a small job is worthy only of a small Want Ad, doesn't go. Another hint-tell in your Want Ad just how to get to the office to apply for work.

Decide the feature about the job which will appeal most, and give it emphasis. The farmer looking for a hired man can always get interest by saying: "Real home cooking, always plenty of second helpings, clean pleasant room." That'll interest the ilk of hired men! Here are some phrases which have worked well in "Help

rewarded," "Permanent work for satisfactory men," "Best going wages," "Apply on job ready for work." Much of the secret of getting labor when labor is scarce is in the simple injunction, "Use plenty of words." Show how

good a job you offer. It's simple. (All Rights Reserved.)
