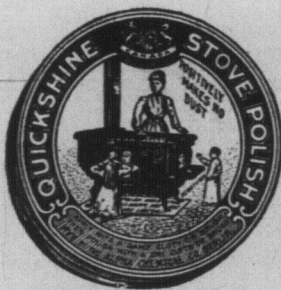

KNOCKED OUT BY PITCHED BALL.

The severe accident to Roger Bresnahan, the New York catcher, last week, is not the sort that happens often to baseball players, but there have been a few such cases. Hugh Jennings, the manager of the Detroit Americans, twice has undergone the alarming experience of being felled by a pitched ball. Both times he was laid low at the Polo grounds by New York pitchers.

Jennings stood up close to the plate when he was an active player, and like Bresnahan, Eberfeld and a few others, would not break ground no matter how much speed the pitcher had. When the Baltimore were here a few years ago, Hughey was struck in the temple by one of Rusie's swift curves and Rusie had terrible speed. Jennings keeled over and was picked up unconscious. He did not play for a while after that, and indeed, was flighty for several days.

In a subsequent game with Meekin pitching, Jennings stopped a pitched ball with his nose. The nose was broken but Jennings was not rendered unconscious. He was groggy, however. Johnny Troy, the old-time ball player, was on the grounds, and set Jennings' nose with a couple of small pebbles. He did a good job of it, for the nose did not need resetting by surgeons.

Jennings is tough. At Cornell once he dived into an empty tank. His head struck the cement bottom instead of the water which he thought was there and he was in a serious condition for some time.
