France Has Not Engaged to So-Operate in the East Africas Blockade.

Paris, Nov. 19.—In the Chamber of Deputies to-day M. Goblet, Minister of Foreign Affairs, stated that France had not engaged to co-operate with England and Germany in a blockade of the coast of East Africa. Both powers, he said, had requested permission from the French Government to search ships flying the French fing which were auspected of heing engaged in the slave trade or importing arms into Africa. The Government had replied that it could not recognize the right of England or Germany to search all vessels under the French flag. Certain abuses due to the slave trade might have arisen, but they did not have the gravity with which it was sought to invest them. They were not to be compared with those perpetrated in the interior or on the coast of North Africa, Nevertheless a French war ship would be sent to prevent slave trading being conducted under the French flag.
