Some of our friends have expressed themselves (as we are told) rather coolly in favour of any presentment; arguing that a proportion of whatever surplus should be over provincial allowances, which should be required for a new erection, would be levied on those parts of the present county which in a short time is expected to be erected into a separate County, and that this would be subjecting them to a double contribution.
