All ovor Now England vast damago has resulted from forest fires of late. Thoy are the result of tho very causes to which wo alluded at the time montioned. The drouth has dried up tho brooks, and transfirmed the country thore into a voritablo tiuder box. Many of these Now England fires aro caused by carclessness on the part of huntors, who leave their unquenched camp fires or carlessly drop their matches with which thoy 1 i :'t their pipes, and in a very fow hours an unc antrollable flame carries destruction with it 30 :vory direction, until citios and villages are threatences with complete destruc tion. The damage from this source alrcady amounts to hundreds and thousands of dollars, and in many directions the people en masse are compellad to desist from their usual vocations to fight the destroying elenent. Tho danger in Michigan from tho same source is not yet past and will not be until the setting in of tho heavy fall rams, and the utmost care, and every pre cautionary measure is dasirable in order that the great danger may be avorted, and a repetition of the desolation of 1880 avoided. Every local paper in ths Wolverine state should not desist from sounding the alarm until the dry scason is at an end.-Lumberman's Tazette.

Trce-SInnting Extrwordinary.
Tho Muxican Government has contracted with Mr. Oscar A. Droege, to plant 2,000,000 trees in the Valley of Mexico within four years from March 15, 1884-500,000 a year, in such places as tuo Governinent shall choosa. The contractor p!edges hienself to cstablieh a number of uurseries and to have in them each year at least 800,000 esh, 85,000 willowe, 120,000 poplars, 60,000 cucalyptus trees, 60,000 tranoosjapores, 00,000 mountain cypress cedars, 00,000 acacias, and 120,000 of miscellaneous rarieties. The trees must bo in planiations of from 00,000
to 100,000 cach, and Mr. Drogge has to maintain them for two years after planting. He is not compelled to plant troes along the highways, howover. Threu graduntes of the School of Agriculture are to bo received into the nurseries each year, there to study the scienco of torestry, Ho is also to raiso fruit and other usoful plants for free distribution. There is to bo translated from the German every year a work on arboriculturo of recognized morit. An inspector is to suporintend, and Mr. Drocgo is to receive annually 40,000 dollars ( $\$ \$, 500$ ) till the sum rench. es a total of 200,000 dollars ( $(42,500)$.-Pall Mall Gazetle.

## Jalling Rozw.
