PRAYER DURING THE PRINCE OF WALES'S VISIT TO INDIA.

The Archbishop of Canterbury has issued the following order to the clergy of his Diocese:—

The Archbishop of Canterbury requests the clergy of his Diocese to give notice during Divine service that,—

“The Prayers of the Congregation are desired for the Prince of Wales during his journey in India; that it may be for his own best happiness, for the welfare of the empire, and for the glory of Almighty God.”

The words were used on Tuesday in Westminster Abbey immediately before the Prayer for the Royal Family, and will be said on all Sundays before that prayer and the Litany during the Prince's absence in India. A pause was made after the name of the Prince of Wales, both in the prayer and in the Litany.

THE NEW DEAN OF CHICHESTER.

“The Rev. J. W. Burgon, Fellow of Oriel, and Vicar of St. Mary's, Oxford,” says the *Standard*, “has been appointed by Her Majesty to the Deanery of Chichester.” The present appointment is one for which loyal Churchmen may well thank the Premier. Mr. Burgon is known as a learned High Churchman of the old school, and his protests against Ritualism, like those of *Quousque*, have been vigorous. Mr. Burgon took his degree in 1845. His latest work, *The Last Twelve Verses of St. Mark's Gospel Vindicated*, an admirable book, displays considerable scholarship and critical power. On several occasions, it may be added, Mr. Burgon has sharply criticized the Latitudinarianism so sadly prevalent at Oxford.—*Record*.
