Israel

Overview

The Canada-Israel Free Trade Agreement, now in its second decade of operation, has generated a considerable increase in two-way trade and investment as well as research and technology cooperation.

The Canada-Israel Industrial Research and Development Foundation (CIIRDF), a binational organization established in 1994, promotes industrial collaboration in innovative technologies that have the potential for commercialization. It provides partnership facilitation services, as well as potential funding for joint industrial research and development (R&D) projects. In addition, the CIIRDF has developed close linkages between a large number of technology-based firms in Canada and Israel, while encouraging the participation of the academic and government research communities.
