Mr. Pearson, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House a copy of a Press Release dated April 20, 1967, containing a statement by the Prime Minister of Canada on the 50th Anniversary of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. (English and French)

Bill C-212, An Act to amend the National Defence Act and other Acts in connection therewith (as amended in the Standing Committee on National Defence) was again considered in Committee of the Whole, reported on and passed with further amendments, considered as amended, and ordered for a third reading at the next sitting of the House.

By unanimous consent, at 5.10 o'clock p.m., the sitting was suspended until 5.00 o'clock p.m.
