Bill C-158, an Act to amend the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1971—Chapter No. 63, 1988.

Bill C-147, an Act to establish the International Centre for Human Rights and Democratic Development—Chapter No. 64, 1988.

Bill S-21, an Act to revive Grenville Aggregate Specialties Limited and to provide for its continuance under the Canada Business Corporations Act.
