Mr. Herridge—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of calling a Dominion-Provincial conference on conservation with a view to the establishment of nationwide principles on soil, forest and water conservation and land use for Canada.

Mr. Rapp—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of taking the necessary steps to bring rapeseed under the jurisdiction of the Canadian Wheat Board by amending the present Act, Volume 11, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1952, Chapter 44, Clause 2, Sub-Clause (e), to include rapeseed.

Mr. Thomas—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to appointing a special committee to review the Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act with a view to providing security for the families of Members by: (a) Increasing the contributions provided for under this Act to the level of the contributions required under the Public Service Superannuation Act. (b) Bringing the benefits of this Act into line with those of the Public Service Superannuation Act.

Mr. Martin (Timmins)—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to the advisability of the establishment of a 100th Anniversary Committee, with provision for Federal, Provincial and Municipal representation for the purpose of immediately launching and pursuing a programme of planned economic and social development, designed to meet and overcome many problems facing Canada, with a view to make 1967 a milestone of achievement as a Nation whose abundance is shared by all Canadians.

Mr. Badanai—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of extending old age assistance to unmarried women and widows of 60 years of age.

Mr. Crestohl—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of amending the Income Tax Act so as to provide for the exemption from income taxes of tuition fees paid to universities, vocational training schools, military colleges, academies and other institutions of higher learning, as well as the costs of all text books and scientific equipment necessary to the courses followed in these institutions of learning.

Mr. MacLellan—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to the advisability of providing special corporate tax concessions for industries in the Atlantic Provinces, to attract new industries and to stimulate the expansion of present industry in the Atlantic region.
