MAGDALEN ISLANDS.

The Rev. J. Chambers writes :--

In forwarding my report for this summer's work, I have to say that only one or two things of more than ordinary

importance have taken place.

The Bishop arrived at Amherst Island on Thursday, 25th July, in ss. "Albert;" the Mission boat being in readiness ran alongside to convey His Lordship to Grindstone Island. distant about ten miles from Amherst. A smart breeze blowing, the boat soon ran across the Bay and arrived safely. Arrangements were made to proceed to Grosse Isle on Saturday, ready for Divine Service on Sunday. day appointed, the boat was got ready and we embarked. The leaden hue and flying scud foretold heavy weather, but we were limited to time, the Bishop wishing to visit the whole group before the arrival of the next steamer, which would be in a fortnight. Had it not been for this we should probably have postponed the visit; but with the strong favourable wind then blowing there was good probability of our arriving at Grosse Isle before the heavy part of the breeze should strike. In this, however, we were disappointed, for we had hardly been under weigh half-an-hour before the gale began, the sea lashed furiously, sail after sail was reefed, and, at last, all the boat could carry was a close-reefed foresail. Fifteen miles had yet to be traversed, and the question was whether we should proceed or run under a point of land jutting further into the Bay. The latter was decided upon, and bringing
