

Their loss is computed to be about fifteen hundred men, which fell chiefly upon their regulars.

*References to the battle fought on Thursday the 13th of September, 1760.*

- 1 The landing of the *British* troops, which began about four, and was completed by seven in the morning.
- 2 *British* troops drawn up in line of battle, with the artillery in the centre.
- a The 15th regiment,—*Amberst's*  
b 2d battalion of *Royal Americans*  
c 58th regiment,—*Anstruther's*  
d 78th regiment,—*Higblanders*  
e 47th regiment,—*Lascelles's*

- 3 *Light infantry*, to cover the rear
- 4 3d battalion of *Royal Americans*, detached to cover the landing-place.
- 5 *French* army, drawn up in line of battle between eight and nine in the morning, with one field-piece in the centre.
- 6 *Canadians* and *Indians*, posted in parties to attack our flanks and rear.
- 7 The House, and batteries of four guns, which the *French* abandoned on our landing, and afterwards made an attempt to recover them, but were repulsed.
- 8 2000 men from *Cape Rouge*, under the command of M. *de Bougainville*, to attack our army in the rear; but this corps being repulsed by the *Light infantry* at the house and four gun battery, wheeled off to 9.9, against whom General *Townshend* advanced two pieces of artillery, and two battalions; upon which they retired.
- 10 Admiral *Saunders*, with nine men of war and one frigate.
- 11 Admiral *Holmes's* division, to protect the landing.

*N. B.* There were some skirmishes before the action, whilst the dispositions on both sides were making: after the action there was a severe skirmish; which being ended, we remained sole masters of the field.
