

3d.—Whether the work has been done by contract or by day labour.

4th.—The description of country traversed by the Road,—whether fit for cultivation, and whether there are any steep hills on the line over which the road has been necessarily carried, and on what part of the Road they are met with.

5th.—The description of the country, as far as it is known to you, through which the remainder of the Road yet unopened is to be carried, as well as if the Road leads only to the waste lands of the Crown, whether those lands are of a description to encourage settlement.

6th.—A statement of the money that has been advanced to you—the amount that has been expended and accounted for, and the sum, if any, that remains in your hands.

7th.—Whether the sum appropriated for the road will be sufficient to complete it, or what further sum might be required for that purpose.

I have only to add, that His Excellency hopes you will lose no time in preparing this Report, and that it may be transmitted to each Branch of the Legislature within fifteen days after the opening of the Session.
