After the close of the exchanges bids as high as 24c were made for Preston in thousand share lots. The highest price aid during the day was 22, but even at this the stock showed a three-point advance for the session, 19 being the current quotation on Wednesday.

There has been a great deal of short selling of the stock recently, and it is highly probable that there was a stampede of the shorts as a result of the higher levels recorded to-day. Some spectacular ore from the claim adjoining the Deloro holding of the company was on exhibition in a local brokerage office, and this probably influenced sentiment also.
