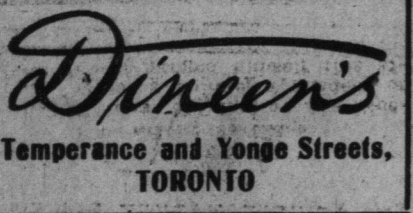

FOUND DEAD IN HIS WAGON GOING HOME FROM THE CITY

George F. Stiver of Markham Tp. Succumbs from Hemorrhage of the Brain.

Unionville, Nov. 14.—(Special.)—George F. Stiver, one of the best-known and most highly respected farmers in Markham Township, living about a mile west of this village, was found dead in his wagon at the Townline Hotel, some six miles north of East Toronto, about 3 o'clock this afternoon. Deceased was on his way home from the city, and was accompanied by his young son. Shortly after leaving East Toronto, Mr. Stiver is said to have entrusted the management of the team to his son, and lain down in the bottom of the wagon. When O'Sullivan's Corners was reached, it was found that he had expired. Dr. Siseley of Agincourt was passing at the time, and was called in. An examination disclosed that death must have taken place half an hour previously, the cause being hemorrhage of the brain. The remains were subsequently removed to his own home. Deceased was 48 years of age, and was the eldest son of William Stiver of the 5th concession of Markham. He is survived by a widow and large family.

Riverdale.

The sale was made by Mrs. John Thompson, and the price paid was \$8800. The property will, it is said, be subdivided and sold off.

THRU LINE TELEGRAPH COBALT'S GREAT NEED

Delay in Transferring Telegrams Between Services at North Bay Source of Inconvenience.

North Bay, Nov. 14.—(Special.)—Five hundred messages were sent from Cobalt to-day, all handled by a single operator.

It is reported the C. P. R. and the government have arranged to have a thru wire from Toronto to Cobalt in operation next week.

There is no difference of opinion about the fact of the miserable telegraph service supplied the public at Cobalt. Everybody suffers, even the government itself, and there is no end to the worry and friction and annoyance caused by disappointments, dilatory messages, non-deliveries, and all the other faults that go to make up an inferior system.

It is a frequent experience to have a letter, sent to confirm a telegram, reach the person for whom it is intended before the telegram has arrived. This is a source of annoyance, and it is worse than inferior. It is fraudulent. Important business cannot be transacted by wire when a business man has to wait for the telegram to arrive. It would be quicker for him to jump on the train and go to Cobalt than to wait for the telegram to arrive.

On the more disputed question of the proposed adoption of the Cobalt telegraph line, the attitude of the two telegraph companies, and the fact that there was any delay or inconvenience, was admitted, "but since the commission took over the service there has never been 30 minutes' delay as was the case with the old service."

"There is no better," he continued, "and you can't put that as strong as you like. The line is well handled and well maintained."

Hon. Frank Cochrane, who as minister of public works, has charge of such matters, was quite willing to discuss the telegraph situation at Cobalt, and readily admitted that the telegraph service had not been without justification. In fact, he was able to supply instances from his own knowledge. But he thinks that these complaints are not of recent origin, at any rate so far as the Temiskaming line is concerned.

"The staff has been increased," he said, "and Mr. Englehart has taken hold of that department, and I don't think there is any ground for present complaint."

"I have seen a stack of messages that high," he continued, "indicating about two feet of a pile, which could not be delivered. I have known of messages being sent to their hotels and going out in the woods over the country, from east and west, and they cause more pressure than the Toronto business."

"To be considered," he said, "on the larger question of the line to Toronto as the nucleus of a provincial system, Mr. Cochrane had nothing to say. It was a matter for future consideration, about which great caution would be necessary, and there was sufficient on hand for the present."

550 FIRE; 3 MEN INJURED TRUCK AND WAGON COLLIDE

Hose 16 and Aerial 1 in an Accident—Two Firemen Hurt and Horse Killed.

Responding to an alarm from Box 31 at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon, Hose 16, from Richmond-street Station, and Aerial 1, from Lombard-street, came into collision at Church and Lombard-streets. As a result, Lieut. Arthur Everist and Fireman Albert Elliott of the hose section are in St. Michael's Hospital with painful injuries to the head and shoulders. Everist had five stitches in a scalp wound, and Elliott complains of his head aching.

The horse which pulled to hose wagon had to be shot. It is a matter for congratulation that the accident was so slight, for to by apparatus were well manned. Indeed, it is likely due to the prompt and co-ordinated work of Tillerman Harris Smith of the truck that saved the life of Foreman Knight, who was on the running board, and who, when he saw that a collision was inevitable, jumped in the roadway, and the truck, which was drawn by three splendid grey horses, was coming west on Lombard-street after a run of a block. As per driver, James Leslie pulled up, and then, seeing that a trolley car—a danger at the corner—had stopped, he and his horses ahead to clear the crossing, which was done quickly as a matter of safety. The hose wagon had made an extra quick hitch, and a fast run from the station on Richmond-street, which was heading from the east, was thrown headlong from the seat.

Firemen Doughty, Gordon and Crawford were also thrown to the roadway when the crash came. On the truck side, standing beside the driver, on the running board to the north were Mr. McCurdy of the Halifax Herald, Fireman McClelland, Mr. Cameron of the Water-works Engine Works, and Fireman Oliver. On the other side of the truck were Fireman Joyce, McCurdy and Cameron. When at fire headquarters with a party of other officials to test of the big ladder and when the same name had decided to enjoy the excitement of a ride with the firemen.

The shock to the truck was hardly felt, and the only damage was to the windshield, a small piece of wood broke. The truck pulled up within its length, and the men dismounted and ran back to the crossing fully expecting to find at least two men dead, for it was believed they had been run over. Fortunately the horse was not hurt, and the carriage into a nearby street was carried into the salvage wagon and sent at once to the hospital.

The horse had one of its hoofs run over by the truck and had to be shot. The truck is 60 feet over all, and, if an attempt had been made to swing south into Church-street to avoid colliding, would undoubtedly have swept the hose wagon into the car, when the results would have been far worse.

The fire was at 141 Yonge-street, the Leveaux, where the film man, Walter Shank, is in the hospital with his face and hands burned. This is the third fire to take place at these premises in the past few days. Fireman Elliott lost a gold ring with two red stones to fire headquarters.

SHOT BY FOOTPADS.

Young Toronto Man is Badly Injured in Montreal.

Richard Grigg of 345 Parliament-street, and Mrs. Grigg left yesterday morning for Montreal, having received a telegram that their son, Horace, had been shot by footpads in Montreal the previous night.

The young man, who is about 21, was until 18 months ago with the R. Simpson Co. here, and was sent to the Montreal branch.

He reported that he was waylaid, and on refusing to give up his valuables was shot three times.
