SERIOUS ACCIDENT ON THE INCLINE RAILWAY

Two Horses Killed by Falling to Trestle—Occupants Have Marvellous Escape.

HAMILTON, Nov. 1.—(Special).—There was a very serious accident this afternoon on the James-street Incline Railway, in which Robert Carver, a horse farmer, and his sister-in-law, Mrs. D. Carver, were killed, and two horses killed. They drove on the car at the head of James-street to ascend the mountain. When, about half way up the incline, where the cars pass each other, the horses took fright at the descending car, and backed off, falling to the trestlework, a distance of about 200 feet, and Mrs. Carver was pinned down under the wagon.
