NO USE FOR TRADING STAMPS

This Was the Opinion of Merchants Who Were Interviewed by The World Yesterday.

SOME ARE FORCED TO KEEP THEM

Because Their Rivals Do-People Think They Are Getting Something for Nothing.

The World yesterday afternoon interviewed a score or so of merchants in different lines of business, for the purpose of testing their feelings in regard to trading stamps.

Can't Afford Them. "In favor of trading stamps," said Mr. J. F. Morris, grocer, Yonge-street, "Well, I guess not. I am strongly opposed to them, and refuse to handle them under any consideration."

What Trading Stamps Do. Another merchant a little further up the street held very strong opinions on the matter, and he was not averse to expressing them.

County Must Provide its Own Furniture in the New Municipal Buildings.

FIFTEEN APPEALS DISMISSED.

Eight Allowed-City Loses the Appeal in the Horneum Case-Other Judgments.

Twenty-eight judgments were given by the Court of Appeal yesterday at Osgoode Hall. Fifteen appeals were dismissed and eight allowed, and three motions for leave to appeal failed and two succeeded.

The County is Liable. The county failed in the vexed question as to its liability for the furnishings of the new City Hall.

Appeal Against the City. The appeal of the city in the Horneum case failed. In this case Mrs. Mary Horneum, proprietress of the Iroquois Hotel, sued to recover \$1300 taxes she paid on the property under protest.

License Can Be Transferred. The court refused the temperance people permission to appeal against the transfer of the shop license held by Mr. Lawrence from Mr. Spadina-avenue.

Claim of the Daughter of Archbishop Cuthbertson for 100 acres of land, including the major part of the farm of Desrochers, was disposed of by the inclusion of the judgment dismissing the action.

Salvation Army Man. Mrs. Jane Eves of Toronto lost her case against the Salvation Army, she now being declared entitled to a dower in the estate of her husband, who died in 1898.

The Widow Was Barred. The court ruled that the widow of the late Thomas Clarke, was barred in her action against W. Bellamy, the executor of the late husband's estate, for \$2000.

Some of the minor judgments were as follows: Regia v. Murdoch-Appeal dismissed; Fort Stanley v. Herrick-Appeal dismissed.

Hunter v. Ottawa-Original judgment restored; Ontario v. New Brunswick-Appeal allowed; Plaintiff is non-suit; Myers v. Bradford Street Railway Company-Appeal allowed; Plaintiff is non-suit; Kinloch v. Conner-Appeal dismissed; Ferguson v. Galt Public School Board-Appeal allowed.

Francis v. Longways-Appeal dismissed; Ontario v. Galt Public School Board-Appeal allowed; Fraser v. Fraser-Upheld decision for new trial.

Stroud v. Willey-Judgment reversed and action dismissed. The v. Unger-Appeal allowed and action dismissed.

WAS A PORT HOPE SCHOONER

The Volunteer Held at Charlotte on a Claim Against Her Former Owner.

Buffalo, June 29 - Papers in a suit brought by J. C. Barney against the Canadian schooner Volunteer were filed with Judge Jessel in the United States Court this morning.

The schooner was built in 1863 and was owned by Mr. Barney, who was killed near Charlotte and was killed by the schooner. Her captain was without funds to repair the schooner sufficiently to enable him to make a Canadian voyage.

Since then the schooner has changed hands and her new owner changed the name to the Volunteer. A day or two ago she made her appearance at Charlotte again and the present action was begun.

The present owner will have to stand the loss of \$3000 if the suit is decided in Mr. Barney's favor, as the claim lies against the vessel.

New Professor for Knox. The new annual Board of Knox College will meet on Tuesday next to consider the advisability of appointing another professor for the chair of zoology.

Knox Church Pastorate. The Presbytery will meet in Knox Church schoolhouse on Tuesday morning and make arrangements for the induction of Rev. Dr. Johnston, in the event of his accepting the pastorate of Knox Church.
