Lexington, Ky., Oct. 4.—The \$5000 Transylvania Stake, the feature today, was a fine trot, with four different heat winners, and the favorite, Early Dreams, standing best in the summary.
The deciding heat of the Phoenix Hotel, free-for-all race was won by Miss Harris M. from William in 2:04 1/2, the time being the fastest of the year for a mare in a race, and within a quarter of a second of the world's record for pacing mares.
