AUSTRALIAN TRADE SHOWS BIG GAIN

Stocks and Herds Increase Plentiful Rains Assure Heavy Crops.

U.S. GOODS POPULAR

American Manufacturers Get More Business That Formerly Went to Germans.

Understanding the severe strain placed on the war, the Commonwealth of Australia enjoyed a large volume of foreign trade during the year 1916 which is likely to be maintained and increased during 1917.

According to a statement of Stanley Ross, commercial agent in charge of the New York office of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce at the custom house.

This prediction for 1917 was based on a recent report from the American consul general at Sydney, who advised that plentiful rainfalls had assured large crops of grain and abundant pasture for stock and wool.

ORIGIN OF "MISSISSIPPI." Great Britain, France, and the other allies, and the men at the front will require 1,100,000,000 bushels of wheat.
