Committee to draft Address to the Queen and to the Governor.

The Synod appointed the following Committee to prepare Drafts of Addresses to the Queen,—and to the Governor-General, viz., Mr. Romanes, (Convener,) Dr. Mathieson, Mr. Barclay, Mr. Cruickshank, Hon. Mr. Crooks, and Mr. Cameron.

Alteration in the list of the Nine Commissioners.

The Synod appointed the Hon. William Morris, of Montreal; the Hon. James Crooks, West Flamboro'; and, Alexander McMartin, Esq., Martintown, to be Commissioners of the Synod under the Clergy Reserve Act, in room of the Rev. Dr. Black, deceased, and the Rev. Dr. Liddell, and Charles Tait, Esq., resigned:—the Hon. William Morris to be Chairman of the Board of Commissioners. And the Clerk was instructed to communicate this alteration in the list of the Commissioners to the Governor-General, and also to the Board.

Reference anent Mr. Ross' allowance. The Synod had transmitted to them by their Committee of Bills and Overtures, a Reference from the Presbytery of Hamilton, for advice as to the course to be pursued, in order to recover for Mr. Ross the Government allowance originally held by him while at Aldboro'. The Synod having heard a statement of the case, and of the proceedings of the Presbytery of Hamilton thereanent, instructed the Presbytery of Hamilton to draw up a full statement of the grounds on which the allowance is claimed, and to transmit the same to the Clergy Reserve Commissioners, to be by them laid before the Government.
