Ottawa Mayor Saves City \$6,000 by Direct Sale Methods.

Ottawa, Nov. 30—A saving of \$6,000 owing to an advantageous exchange rate was not the only economy effected by Mayor Plant and the City Treasurer last Thursday, when they motored to New York, taking with them City of Ottawa debentures valued at \$2,642,000. By taking the debentures to New York by motor car the Mayor saved the city heavy express and insurance charges that would have been incurred had the bends been shipped through the regular clannels. Mayor Plant and Treasurer Corbett got through safely, leaving Ottawa at seven o'clock in the morning and reaching New York at midnight.
