ARGE PURSES OF THE 1921 SEASON

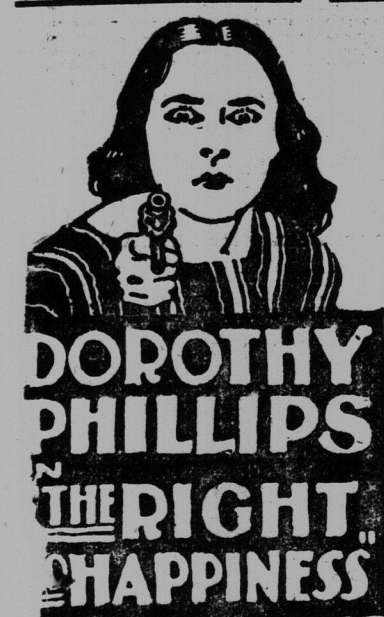
Seven Stables that Won More

Louisville, Ky., Jan. 30.—Eastern sta-
tioned all the largest purses in the
1921 racing season, according to figures
compiled by turf authorities. Five sta-
bles and two in Kentucky each
more than \$100,000 in purses of
the Rancocas stable, Sinclair
Hildreth, won the largest amount by
winning more than \$250,000.

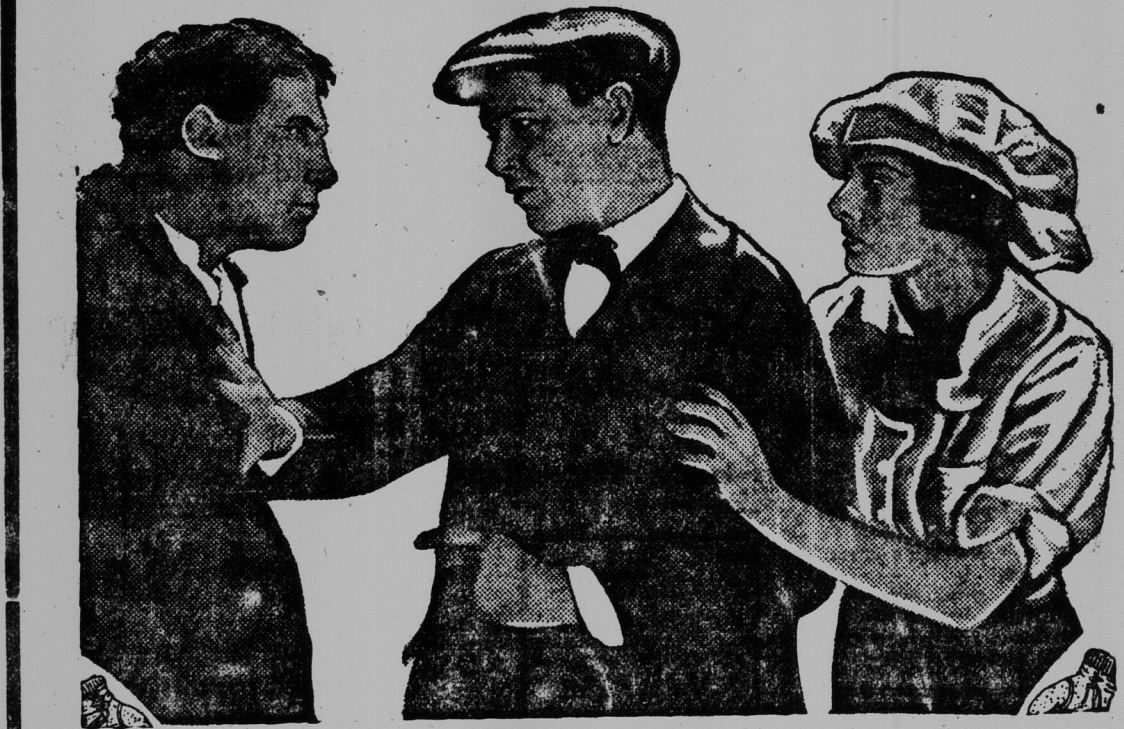
