Returned Men Declare They Received Much Benefit By the

(Toronto Mail and Empire.)

Appreciation of the work done overseas by the Khaki University has been received in the form of the following letter from P. S. Warren of London Grange, Brechin:

"Among the members of the O. M. F. C. recently repartiated on the S. S. Regina were some fifty officers and other ranks who were attending various British universities during the period of demobilization. These men arranged a meeting at which the following resolution was unanimously adopted: (a) That this body wish to place on record an acknowledgment of their great debt of gratitude to Colonel Tory and to those associated with him who have made it possible for them to secure this opportunity of studying in the great centres of learning in the British isles; (b) That a letter be written to the leading Canadian nowspapers in order to bring to the attention of the Canadian people the work of inestimable value performed by the Education Services, O. M. F. C. "We do not intend to outline the work undertaken by the Khaki University of the canadian soldiers. 
