Paris, May 18—Japan and China have been informed by the Allied governments that they have arranged for Entente military co-operation to keep the dangers threatening the peace of the Far East from German penetration.

Washington, May 10—The Entente military co-operation arranged to meet the threats to the peace of the Far East by German penetration, as reported to-day from Paris, is understood here as purely a defensive measure, in which participation for the present will be confined to Japan and China. Its primary purpose is the safeguarding of Manchuria with the possibilities of its extension to Siberia.
