Fredericton, May 20.—That all the drives on the Upper St. John River have been brought out was the statement made today by F. Chouinard, of St. Pamphile with Mrs. Chouinard, was at the Barker House over Sunday. The total amount of lumber to come from the Upper St. John this year to the booms here amounts to about 90,000,000 feet, of which about 60,000,000 feet is now said to be in the booms; there is also between 20,000,000 and 30,000,000 feet for the St. John Lumber Company and other mills in Maine above the Grand Falls.
