BUDGET NOT READY FOR THREE WEEKS

Motion re Bankruptcy Act is Withdrawn in Parliament—Today's Program.

(By Canadian Press.)

Ottawa, March 27.—In the House of Commons, yesterday, a resolution that the Easter recess for the House extend from March 28 to April 9 was passed without debate.

That the budget will not be brought down for at least another three weeks

was announced by the Minister of Finance.

P. F. Casgrain, Liberal, Charlevoix-Montmorency, moved for the amendment or abrogation of the Bankruptcy Act. He claimed that the law fostered fraud and financial difficulties. Several other members from Quebec province joined in condemning the act. Members of the Conservative benches suggested that the principle of the legislation was good, though undoubtedly from time to time it would need amendment.

Sir Lomer Gouin, Minister of Justice, spoke in favor of a uniform Bankruptcy Law, and suggested that it might be well to amend the present act so as to include in the law formerly in force in Quebec. The motion was ultimately withdrawn.

A resolution that, save in case of invasion, Canada should not be committed to participation in war without the consent of the Parliament of Canada was introduced by C. G. Power, Quebec. He argued against sentimental, moral and constitutional reasons for

Mrs. Markham's Appointment.

Mrs. Violet Markham Carruthers, of England, who is to represent Canada, at the eighteenth session of the governing body of the International Labor office as substitute delegate for Hon. James Murdock, Minister of Labor, was appointed at the suggestion of Mr. Murdock, of Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, according to correspondence in the matter, brought down at the request of Right Hon. Arthur Meighen.

More than eighty-three million pounds of American bacon sides have been imported into Canada from the U. S., cured and then shipped to England within the last four years. This information was given by Hon. James Bureau, Minister of Customs.

Before adjournment Hon. George P. Graham, Acting Minister of Railways,

announced that he would bring down his annual railway budget today in order that members of the House might have it before them during the Easter recess.

Matter of Estimates.

The Premier announced that he had received word from Hon. Charles Murphy to the effect that Mr. Murphy would not be able to return to Ottawa until after the middle of May. The Premier therefore hoped that the Right Hon. Mr. Meighen would withdraw his objection to proceeding with the post office estimates. Estimates to be taken up today will be the remainder of the defence, public works and trade and commerce departments.

Today in Parliament.

In the House of Commons, today, a interim supply bill, covering one-half

of the estimates for the coming year, will be introduced. The Minister of Railways will present his railway budget, after which the House will go into committee of supply on estimates.

GREECE AND TURKEY  
London, March 27.—The Greek Government has announced its policy on the refugee questions, say an Athens dispatch to the Times. This policy is a direct challenge to the Turks, demanding that the Ankara Government send ships to transport the Turkish populations from Greece and declaring that it is absolutely impossible for Greece to receive more refugees until an exchange of populations is arranged whereby the Turks now residing in Greece will cede their homes to an equal number of Anatolian Greeks.
