MINISTER ENTERTAINED AT PRINCE RUPERT

Citizens Honor the Member for Comox-Atlin Constituency.

Monday night, August 25th, this city, which not long since was a wilderness... was the scene of a social function which could only be rivaled in the great metropolis, says the Prince Rupert Optimist.

After the toast to the King, G. W. Morrow proposed 'The Dominion and Our Guest,' which was received with applause and prolonged cheers.

Hon. Mr. Templeman then rose to reply, thanking Mr. Morrow for his flowery compliments and the audience for their genial and whole-souled greeting.

When last here I heard that charming ballad 'We're here, because we're here,' and now to-night it rings again in my ears.

'You have at your doors the greatest deep sea fisheries in the world. When I was here last and at your rival city of Simpson (daughter) my friend Mr. Hogan suggested that we have no Dreadnaughts but destroyers to protect our fisheries.

'I am glad to see with us here to-night Archdeacon Collison and Mr. Hogan. I do not know any men for whom we should have greater regard than for the pioneer missionaries of this coast.

'I am a member of the Dominion government and you honor me for it. I must thank you on the part of the government. The Dominion government is taking keen interest in Prince Rupert. There have been some eight or ten men, officials of the Dominion here recently, who have been looking after your welfare.
