TELEGRAPHERS STRIKE IS NOT A TIE-UP

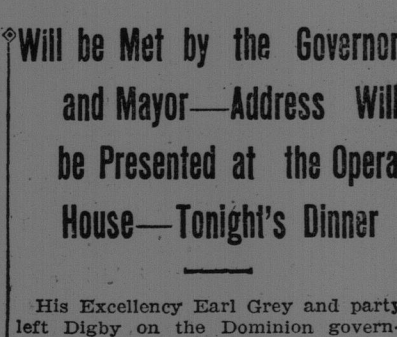
Thousands of Men Are Out, But Work Goes On

JAPS HAVE HARD FIGHT WITH REBELLIOUS KOREANS

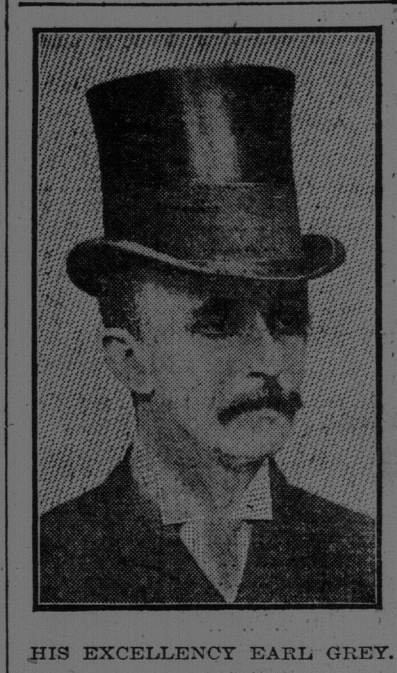
An Island Held by the Deserting Troops Captured Yesterday After a Sharp Engagement
