LONDON, Sept. 7—The latest American invention is a submarine for salving wrecks, and it will be used in an attempt to salve H. M. S. Lutine, which was wrecked off Terschelling Island, on the coast of Holland, in 1799.

"The submarine is fitted with a special internal apparatus," said J. Garner Flood, who will be engaged in the work.
