




Quick Work.

The grounding of the Canadian flagship Niobe at Cape Sable Saturday night resulted in a hurried call for assistance here and the government steamers Lady Laurier and Stanley, which happened to be here together loading supplies, put to sea in all haste at about 5 o'clock yesterday worning. G. H. Flood, marine agent, received a telephone message from Mr. Harvey, the marine agent at Halifax, requesting that help be sent to the stranded cruiser. A message was sent to the two government vessels and no time was lost in getting up steam. The Stanley was I laden with concrete and other material for repair work on the various lighthouses, and also had coal and other supplies, and the Lady Laurier was to take some buoys down the bay. As much as possible was taken off the steamers on the wharf and almost together they swung off into the stream and headed out in the bay. This was within an hour after Mr. Flood got word of the mishap. There was much to contend with as beside a heavy sea running there was a thick fog. They were not long outside when they got into wireless communication with the Niobe
