

Ireland's Flax Crop

The flax crop is engaging the attention of agriculturists in the north of Ireland. Flax pulling is giving employment to every hand that can be engaged, and factory workers, clerks and business men are joining in this indispensable work. The cadet corps of the Royal Academical Institute of Belfast is also engaged in pulling flax. Before the war the price paid for flax ranged from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per stone. The highest price ever paid for flax was \$3 per stone in 1884, during the Civil war. This year the flax supply committee has arranged to take over the whole crop at prices ranging from \$7.50 to \$10 per stone, according to quality. The flax will be divided into six grades.




