

the said Admirals do Yearly keep a Journal of the number of all Ships, Boats, Stages and Trains, and of all the Seamen belonging to and Employed in each of their respective Harbours, and shall also (at their Return to England) deliver a true Copy thereof under their Hands, to his Majesties most Honourable Privy Council.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That in case any Difference or controverſie shall arise in Newfoundland, or the Islands thereunto adjoyning, between the Masters of Fishing-Ships and the Inhabitants there, or any By-Boat-keeper, for or concerning the Right and Property of Fishing-Rooms, Stages, Flakes or any other Building or Convenience for Fishing or Curing of Fish, in the several Harbours or Coves, the said Differences, Disputes and Controverſies, shall be Judged and Determined by the Fishing Admirals, in the several Harbours and Coves; And in Case any of the said Masters of Fishing Ships, By-boat-keepers or Inhabitants, shall think themselves Agrieved by such Judgment or Determination, and shall Appeal to the Commanders of any of his Majesties Ships of War, appointed as Convoys for Newfoundland, the said Commander is hereby Authorized and Impowred to Determine the same, pursuant to the Regulation in this Act.

And
