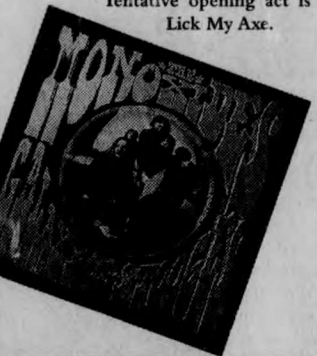
Stuck in the '70s: The Monoxides don't fear the reaper
