Dear Mr. Pugsley: Re Waterloo Post Office--North Waterloo.

I am sending this note just to remind you that I am hoping the Government will find it possible to begin work on the Waterloo Post Office at an early date, and that an amount to cover the same may appear in the estimates being prepared for the ensuing fiscal year. A site, as you doubtless know, has been purchased, and the community is very much in need of a suitable office. The present premises are wholly inadequate, and the need for better accommodation has been experienced for many years. My constituents were led to believe that the work would be undertaken forthwith, and I knew that any further delay will materially prejudice my standing in the riding.

I think it is all of twenty years since the Berlin Post Office was erected, and it is the only public building which has ever been erected by the Dominion Government in the riding of North Waterloo. The Berlin Post Office has long since become inadequate for its work. By erecting a suitable post office at Waterloo, with accommodation for revenue purposes, etc., some of the work which is at present overcrowding the Berlin office
