FOREWORD

Aircraft and Radio (or Wireless) will soon be among the foremost and most important of world activities, covering the whole world (including what have been considered, until recently, remote spots upon the earth). Therefore, it is essential that these two shall work to-gether, In the post-war period is is internationally very necessary that there must be some central organization for their regulation, having as its fundemental aim the equitable and most efficient arrangement of these services between all nations, to avoid confusion, prevent interference, provide and enforce safety rules and generally aid in the progress of man's newest services for the benefit of all, in such manner that they shall no be the cause of disputes and strife, which may threaten world security. Following are some basic ideas dealing with international problems in aerial activities.
