"I went up stairs to investigate I found that the door to my room head been broken open and the top panel pushed right out. I tried the key but it wouldn't work and I was helped through the top panel."

"When I got to my room I saw the ward robe doors which I always kept locked had been forced open. I saw that most of my clothes had been stolen and all the bottles of liquor. The articles missing were:

10 Dresses 2 Light Cloth Coats 2 Suits 1 Fur Coat

5 Bottles of Cognac 4 Bottles of Picon Liqueur 4 Bottles of Perneau Liquor 5 Bottles of other Liquor.

when I saw this I thought of a fur coat belonging to my aunt which was hanging down stairs I went down to check and found that it had also been taken."

"I had been up to my room about 6 o'clock that aftermoon and everything was in order. The other fur coat was hanging up in the Cafe on a hook on the wall and I had last seen it about 1630 hrs."

"I was very shocked and when I recovered I learned that the Officer who had reported the door open to me had gone to call the military police. A Sgt from the Military Police came in with an interpreter and made a report."

"The next day I was informed that some of these articles had been found. I went to get them and found:

7 dresses 2 Light Cloth coats 2 Bottles of Cognac 2 Bottles of Picon Liqueur l Tailored suit.

these articles were part of the stock I kept in my wardrobe."

"I did not see any one breaking into my room. The radio in the Cafe was turned on and a lot of customers were there. I did not hear any one breaking in. I do not remember ever seeing the accused before.
