[In the Scottish language the letter A has four different sounds: 1. A, as in all, wall. 2. A, short as in lak', mak', tak'. 3. A, open as in Dad, daddie. 4. A, slender or close, as in lame, alone, name. A is frequently used instead of O, as in aine, bane, stane, lang, sang, stan.]
