

Market Review and Forecast

TORONTO, Monday, July 30.—During the past week the general tendency of prices was down. These certain lines of commodities show an advance in prices. Millers have increased the price of flour 60c per barrel and mill-

WHEAT.—Last week prices improved to the two-dollar mark, with subsequent bids going as high as \$2.12. Hides rose to \$2.30, one transaction taking place at that figure. When it was announced that the Canadian Board of Agriculture had fixed the maximum price of \$2.14 a bushel on wheat, to be effective August 1st, buyers immediately became inactive.

COARSE GRAINS.—The market is practically stationary and we hardly anticipate any real change until the arrival of the new crop.

MEAT.—The market is practically stationary and we hardly anticipate any real change until the arrival of the new crop. Current quotations are: Manitoba cuts, Track Bay port, No. 2 C, W. \$14.25; tario wheat, No. 2 winter, \$2.55, according to freight; Ontario, No. 2, \$2.52.

MILL FEEDS.—The mill feed market is strong, with an advance in price of \$2 per ton. Business brisk in middlings. Bran is quoted \$3 to \$3.25 per ton, shorts \$4.90 to \$4.1, middlings \$4.1 to \$4.4.

HAY AND STRAW.—The baled hay market remains quiet, with practically no business reported. The excellent weather prevailing during the past week has been causing the farmers to "make hay while the sun shines" liberally and metaphorically.

DAIRY PRODUCE.—Eggs are very firm in the country these days and the wholesalers are paying from 35c to 36c per dozen. They are still very scarce and it is considered so for some time. Receipts are not sufficient for the consumption, and the price is bound to hold steady. Butter continues firm, in spite of the fact that the supplies do not warrant it, nor does the quotation ruling in the old country. Wholesalers are paying 34c to 35c for the prints. CHEESE BOARD SALES.

Bellefonte, Ont., July 21.—At today's cheese board, 2,060 boxes white were offered, 1,000 sold at 51c; balance at 20 15-16c. London, Ont., July 21.—1,560 boxes were offered at to-day's cheese board meeting. Sold: 600 sold at 50 1/2c. Vanandale Hill, Ont., July 21.—There were 1,623 boxes of white and 50 boxes of colored cheese boarded at the Vanandale Hill Cheese Board. All sold at 29 1/2c. Three buyers present.

London, Ont., July 23.—At today's cheese board 745 boxes were offered. All sold at 29 1/2c. Brockville, July 25.—At to-day's cheese Board meeting the following were boarded: White, 3,765; colored, 710. All sold at 29 1/2c.

Stirling, July 25.—720 boxes were offered. All sold at 19-18 1/2c. Kingston, July 26.—721 white and 111 colored were offered, 650 boxes selling at 29 1/2c.

Piston, July 27.—At 19 factories boarded, 1,995 boxes of cheese: 335 boxes sold at 21-1 1/2c, the balance at 21c. Napanee, July 27.—Two thousand and ninety-seven boxes boarded, 1,650 boxes white; 415 colored; all sold at 20 15-16c. Cambridge, July 27.—525 boxes of white cheese were boarded, all sold at 21c. Frensdale, July 27.—710 boxes of colored and 210 boxes of white cheese were boarded, but all sold on the curb at 21 1/2c. Perth, Ont., July 27.—There were 1,500 boxes of cheese on the market here today. All sold at 29 1/2c.

Conroy, July 27.—273 boxes of white and 203 boxes of colored cheese were sold at 21 1/2c. Alexandria, July 27.—801 boxes of white cheese were offered. All sold at 29 1/2c. Usual buyers.

Very little business is being done, but the tone of the market remains firm. Current prices reported as follows: Canadian five-pound pickers, 9.25 to 9.50. Rainbow beans, 8.75 to 9.15. Yellow beans, 7.50 to 7.75. Japan-eye beans, 8.00 to 8.25.

LIVE STOCK.

The offerings last week amounted to 5,400 calves, 792 hogs and lambs, 3,747 hogs and 1,433 calves. The market opened brisk with the largest offering of cattle made in many weeks. A good volume of business was done on the first day, and a fair amount during the following days. Choice steers were steady at the prices of the previous week; good cattle at prices from 15c to 16c to 17c and cow from 2c to 40c less than those of the previous week. The small amount of sheep, a bigger run being made in sheep and lambs than for a long time. Spring calves brought a low price, as they were sold as 31c. Calves were a very good offering and prices advanced to 12 to 15 1/2c. Offerings of hogs were light and prices descended another 50c per 100 lbs.
