We, the Bocialist Party of Camada affirm our allegiance to, and support of the principles and programme of the revolutionary working class. Labor, applied to natural resources, produces all

Labor, applied to natural resources, produces all wealth. The present common system is based upon capitalist ownership of the means of production, consequentity, all the products of labor belong to the capitalist class. The capitalist is, therefore, master; the worker a slave.

So long as the sapitalist class remains in possession of the reins of government all the powers of the State will be used to protect and defend its property rights in the means of wealth production and its control of the product of labor.

The capitalist system gives to the expitalist as everswelling stream of profits, and to the worker, an everincreasing measure of misory and degradation.

The interest of the working class lies in setting itself free from capitalist exploitation by the abelition of the wage system, under which this exploitation, at the point of production, is cloaked. To accomplish this necessiates the transformation of capitalist property in the means of wealth production into socially controlled comomic forces.

The irrepressible conflict of interest between the expstalist and the worker necessarily expresses itself as a struggle for political supremacy. This is the Class Struggle.

Therefore we call upon all workers to organize under the hanner of the Socialist Party of Canada, with the object of comquering the political powers for the purpose of setting up and enforcing the economic pregramme of the working class, as follows:

1—The transformation, as mpidly as possible, of capitalist property in the means of wealth production (natural resources, fasterteries, mills, railroads, etc.) into collective means of production.


