Brady. Daring his career he became known as one of the most prominent cap-italists in the country, with heavy interests in a number of leading in-dustrial companies. SISTER MARY CLARE RUSSILL

The joyous preparations for the Festival of Christmas were suddenly interrupted at St. Joseph's Convent, Hamilton, by the entrance of the Angel of Death who spread his sable pall over the Community and called to her eternal reward a devoted member, Sister Mary Clare Russill, who having received all the rites of our Holy Mother, the Church, died on Thursday, Dec. 19th, surrounded by her sorrowing Sisters.

Sister Clare was born at Houns-low, Middlesex, England, on Aug. 2, 1850. Her elementary education was received at Gumley House, Isleworth, an educational establish-ment conducted by a religious order from Lyons, France, known as the Faithful Companions of Jesus.

Both Mr. Farrel and his wife were interested in philanthropic activities and contributed liberally, to various Catholic institutions.
